## THE JOY OF SFX

### LOOKING FOR AN ARTICLE? SFX CAN HELP:

- Go from a citation and abstract in a database to the full text of an article online



- Browse or search for specific journal titles to find out whether they're available online (go to [www.library.jhu.edu/eresources/ejournals/index.html](http://www.library.jhu.edu/eresources/ejournals/index.html)).



- Includes links to interlibrary loan for articles in journals not held in the JHU Libraries



Want to find out whether an article you want is online? Look for the **SFX** button in citations in many of the article databases available through the Libraries' Web site (examples of the buttons are at left).

SFX tells you all the ways a journal or a particular article is available at Hopkins. When you click the SFX button in an article citation, you get a screen like the one at right. SFX indicates online availability of an article in databases like PsycINFO or in e-journal collections like Project Muse and JSTOR. If no online full text is indicated, be sure to click the JHU Libraries Catalog link—we may subscribe to the journal in print and/or online.
