

**East Asian Studies/Library Resources
Fall 2007**

These databases are particularly useful for finding scholarly articles on topics in the fields of East Asian Studies:

Academic Search Premier

(A multi-disciplinary, scholarly database with significant full-text content.)

International Bibliography of the Social Sciences

(Articles, government reports, pamphlets, and books.)

Historical Abstracts

(Scholarly literature on the history of the modern world, except the United States and Canada, from 1450 to the present.)

Periodical Abstract

(Indexes over 2,000 periodicals in the fields of business, economics, literature, psychology, religion, and women's studies with coverage from 1986 to the present.)

Bibliography of Asian Studies

(Subjects pertaining to East, Southeast, and South Asia published worldwide from 1971 to the present.)

In addition, use these databases if they look applicable to your topic:

LexisNexis Academic

(Full-text of news, articles and broadcasts from around the world.)

Proquest Asia Business and Reference

(Information about the economy, institutions, peoples, policies and political processes of the Greater China region)

Humanities and Social Sciences Index Retrospective

(Coverage includes a wide range of interdisciplinary fields covered in a broad array of humanities and social sciences journals. Coverage from 1907 – 1984)

Arts and Humanities Citation Index

(A multidisciplinary database covering the journal literature of the arts, humanities and social sciences. It indexes 1,144 journals around the world)

Social Sciences Citation Index

(A multidisciplinary index to the journal literature of the social sciences. It fully indexes more than 1,725 journals across 50 social sciences disciplines)

Anthropology plus

(international in scope and covers the fields of social, cultural, & physical anthropology, ethnology, archaeology, folklore, material culture, and selected interdisciplinary studies. Coverage from late 19th century to the present.)

AnthroSource

(Current issues of 11 Association journals and bulletins, plus archived issues of all the association publications)

Encyclopedia of Social and Cultural Anthropology

(Articles on anthropological treatment of various concepts. The encyclopedia provides a historical view and individual articles end with a brief selection of recommended readings)
